

Stereotyping and electrotyping have proved a source of great economy to both the author and the publisher. Before the discovery of these processes, a work to be printed as occasion required had to be kept standing in type or else reset for each edition. By electrotyping the forms, only a small number of the first edition need be printed, as additional copies can be taken off at any time. The plates occupy much less space than type matter kept in form, and can easily be stored away for future use. The printers type is released for other work, which in itself is a decided advantage. These two processes also save wear of the original type or cut. Electrotypes have superseded stereotypes for book and magazine work, as they give a clearer impression and are more durable. Three methods of stereotyping are known; the stereotyping, plaster, the clay, and the papier-mache. Only the last is now much employed.
